As we gradually return to in-person gathering as this pandemic moves to the endemic stage, it is something like exiting the house after a long winter, isn't it?

I remember being in East Africa during the 'rainy season.' For two or three days, the humidity would rise, then the clouds would roll in, and then – sometimes with little warning – the rain would pour. It would pound the clay earth for a few minutes, forming little streams everywhere, and then it would let up! It might rain off and on for a day, but then the air would clear, and the humidity would let up. And then it would go through the cycle again a few days later.

For us, on the prairies, we've wanted the rain to come! Now, we have lots of moisture; now, we're needing the warmth to let the water seep into the ground and help seeds sprout upwards.

We are invited into the song of Spring – the praises to God for the moisture and new life! The hymnist writes (in Spanish) "Al caer la lluvia resurge con verdor," saying "when the rain falls, it brings the greenery." It lifts the spirits to see new life emerge, to see the flowers and plants once more! And, in their way, the blossoms and leaves praise Creator-God as they lift their way upwards. We join that song!

# QUOTES FROM REVELATIONS OF DIVINE LOVE

Written between the 14th and 15th centuries by Julian of Norwich, Revelations of Divine Love is the earliest surviving example of a book in the English language known to have been written by a woman.

"Truth sees God, and wisdom contemplates God, and from these two comes a third, a holy and wonderful delight in God, who is love."

"...we need to fall, and we need to be aware of it; for if we did not fall, we should not know how weak and wretched we are of ourselves, nor should we know our Maker's marvellous love so fully..."

"And in this he showed me a little thing, the quantity of a hazel nut, lying in the palm of my hand, as it seemed. And it was as round as any ball. I looked upon it with the eye of my understanding, and thought, 'What may this be?' And it was answered generally thus, 'It is all that is made.' I marveled how it might last, for I thought it might suddenly have fallen to nothing for littleness. And I was answered in my understanding: It lasts and ever shall, for God loves it. And so have all things their beginning by the love of God.

In this little thing I saw three properties. The first is that God made it. The second that God loves it. And the third, that God keeps it."

"Grace transforms our failings full of dread into abundant, endless comfort ... our failings full of shame into a noble, glorious rising ... our dying full of sorrow into holy, blissful life. .... Just as our contrariness here on earth brings us pain, shame and sorrow, so grace brings us surpassing comfort, glory, and bliss in heaven ... And that shall be a property of blessed love, that we shall know in God, which we might never have known without first experiencing woe."

# Why wearing a mask is important

COVID-19 will continue to spread at different levels in communities across Canada, and outbreaks will still occur.

Masks are one of the most effective individual public health measures that we can use to protect ourselves and others from COVID-19.

When layered with other public health measures, a well-constructed, well-fitting and properly worn mask can help prevent you from:

- getting COVID-19
  - they reduce the amount of infectious respiratory particles you inhale
- spreading COVID-19 to others
  - they contain the infectious respiratory particles you produce if you're infected, even if you don't have symptoms

In the longer term, there may be situations when we need to strongly rely on masking. For example, when there:

- are outbreaks
- is a new variant of concern
- are high levels of COVID-19 cases in your community

## Tips to prevent spread (from City of Toronto)

- Stay up to date with your COVID-19 vaccination, including any booster dose(s) when eligible for the best protection against COVID-19.
- Reduce or limit the number of people you have close contact with, especially indoors.
- Keep a physical distance when possible, especially indoors.
- Stay home if you are sick or have symptoms, even if they are mild.
- Choose well ventilated spaces when possible outdoors is lower risk than indoors.
