Message to the Congregation from the Chairperson by Jett Isleifson

"For as in those days before the flood they were eating and drinking, marrying and giving in marriage, until the day Noah entered the ark, and they knew nothing until the flood came and swept them all away, so too will be the coming of the Son of Man." (Matthew 24:38-39).

Perhaps this scripture is excessively dramatic for our situation but it certainly indicates to us how rapidly our normal routines and priorities can be turned upside down in an instant, "swept away" as it were, and we find ourselves in a new reality.

At our March 9, 2020 Council meeting we met in person as usual and discussed the potential impact of the COVID-19 pandemic on Gloria Dei Lutheran Church. We reviewed our usual worship practices such as how Communion is served and sharing of the peace, after worship fellowship time, use of the building by groups, etc. We expected to carry on but with changed methods with personal protection in mind.

By March 12 the situation began to move rapidly with the proclamation of pandemic by the WHO, the suspension of all activities by the National Hockey League among other professional sports organizations, the cancellation of large public events, the first COVID-19 patients in Manitoba, even self isolation by the Prime Minister of Canada.

It was decided that the our Sunday, March 15 worship service would proceed, and it did, but with extreme personal protection methods in place- the chalice was not used for Communion, special spacing of individual cups in the Communion trays, nonphysical contact during sharing of the peace, no passing of offering plates, availability of hand cleanser in numerous locations, and so on. We believed these methods would become the norm and even stricter as time went on.

By late afternoon Monday, March 16 we were hearing of gatherings in excess of 250 people being prohibited in some jurisdictions, and governmental recommendations being made that gatherings should not exceed 50 people. Schools, libraries, community centres, etc. were being closed and many people were not reporting in to work favouring working from home by Internet if possible. Along with our sister congregations in the ELCIC and with other Christian neighbours, Pastor Tyler Gingrich and I agreed that worship services and all public events at Gloria Dei Lutheran Church were to be suspended until further notice. Our ELCIC bishops sent a letter that same evening recommending this action to all congregations.

The congregation was notified of the decision to suspend worship services by a mass email sent to all members we have email addresses for. Those not on email were contacted by a quickly organized "telephone tree" who made calls. Thank you to those...

who helped with that – Kim Dorn, Sandra Fritz and Jean Hunter. These calls also gleaned members' email addresses we did not yet have.

Our Pastor Tyler Gingrich very swiftly set up the new Gloria Dei website at www.gloriadeiwinnipeg.org. He also established the use of the MailChimp service for mass emails publicizing our new online worship services. Zoom Video Conferencing is now used to stay in contact. We already had a Facebook page as well that is presently seeing more traffic. These were the means used to continue with Sunday morning Bible study, and the online worship service devotionals - a first for Gloria Dei! The worship services are not "live," they are pre-recorded to be viewed on YouTube. For example, the Easter Sunday devotional had 97 views by Easter Monday.

Our members can continue to make offerings, whether by postal mail, personal drop-off at our office, preauthorized debits, eTransfers or by CanadaHelps.org.

We initially hoped to resume worship services by Easter Sunday but such was not to be. Our return to "normal," whatever that may look like, is still indeterminate. We must continue to be aware of our situation and be mindful of the requirements of our Federal and provincial governments.

Thank you Pastor Tyler for all your work establishing an online presence for Gloria Dei during the COVID-19 pandemic. This has been a "wish list" item at Gloria Dei for some time and you have brought it to reality. We must continue using this new tool into the future, beyond the COVID-19 pandemic, and expanding its capabilities for Gloria Dei. Thank you to all our worship assistants, readers, musicians, the Gingrich family, and to all those who are making the online services possible.

Thanks be to you O Lord that, at the time of this writing, no one of us of our Gloria Dei family has been a victim of COVID-19.
