There is a word in theological studies that student-pastors are bound to encounter: *eschatology*. The word means 'the study of last things,' but – in Christianity, particularly in Lutheran circles – we may talk about eschatology as 'the already, and not yet.'



As people of faith, following Christ, we live our lives in this 'already and not yet' time *all* the time. We anticipate the coming of Christ; we also know that Christ walked among people and proclaimed and lived God's reign in the world. We long for a future day, and yet that day is in us to live *now*.

The season of Advent points us to a future time: a time when peace breaks the sounds of war, a time when darkness gives way to light, a time when God enters human history – and the world is never the same.

We begin a new church year, and we fill it with hope, with eager expectation, with the good news that a child's arrival is... and we also are mindful of how the comfortable and familiar places might give way to unknown beginnings, and starting fresh may be unsettling. We are reminded through this time to, both, *keep awake* and *comfort my people* – Christ comes among us, and Christ is present and alive in us! May the blessings of Advent and Christmas be yours!

In-Person Worship Services in December

***Sundays in Advent –
November 28,
December 5, 12, 19
Christmas Eve – December 24***

Attendees pre-register by noon on Wednesday, and are fully vaccinated. We share in the Eucharist, and those joining in bring their own bread and wine (or cracker and juice) and commune in the pew.

Services are video recorded, and then edited, to provide our online worship available on YouTube.

Our in-person gatherings are subject to health orders, based on the risk of virus transmission.

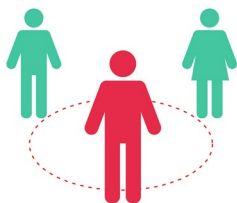
For safety and to reduce risk of virus transmission:

- we wear masks until seated
- if people sing, we ask that they put on their mask

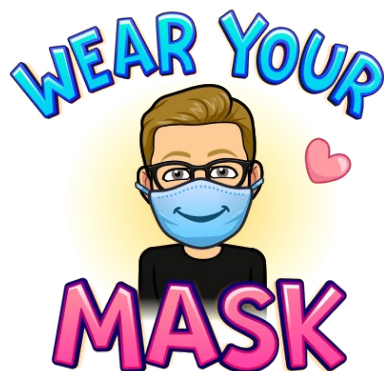
To reduce movement in the space, and contact, we:

- remain seated for the full service; only the leaders stand at the front
- do not pass the offering plate, or shake hands for the peace
- share the Eucharist from where we are and do not approach the front
- do not use hymnals; service is projected on the screen (and a bulletin/service-order is available on our website)

We seek to reduce time, and keep physically distanced, in order to lower the risk of contracting the virus in our building. So the seating is spaced out in our sanctuary, and the services are shorter.
