Bible Study Series "Singing the Unsung" Session Three - Congregation as Choir

Improving congregational song
Note the model of learning song by following a leader
- no notes or words on paper
Requires focus and joining in the moment

song: "Glory Be to God on High" (Argentina)

song: "Amen, Amen, It Shall Be So"

Question: what's the difference between a choir and an assembly/congregation/community...?

Learning from the ears versus from the eyes

Congregation may not be musically literate

"Choirs believe that they can sing; congregations know that they can't." (sort of an unspoken message)

Positioning of people in the church can inhibit or encourage singing; when people sit closer together, they are more likely to join in the singing

Story told of a choir that is organized occasionally, and gathers musical talent from the community - "the bubble up effect"
